Blaine Kline Director of Facilities management spoke about the repair of the ceiling at the Joliet Area Historical Museum gallery, the roof was fixed last year and now the damage that was done to the ceiling needs to be addressed. it will require a few weeks of work, done after hours. We sought 3 proposals and the lowest bid was from Cosgrove Construction in the amount of \$69,275.00. This will come from the capital improvement and building and grounds funds, which there are sufficient funds to pay for this project.

Mr. Kline spoke about the 100 year old building in right field of slammers stadium, due to it's age it contains asbestos and lead and lead which must be remediated. We received 8 bids, Nationwide Environmental & Demo was the lowest at \$227,700. We have the funds in the building and grounds funds to get the work done by the end of the year.

Councilman Clement asked what the plans for the building were moving forward and Mr. Kline stated that would be an economic/community development question, but that it could be redeveloped by the city per past conversations. In any case whatever we planned on doing with the building we had to address the issues of the Lead/asbestos in the building.

Councilman Moreno asked if we were to sell the property, would we be able to see it without the abatement taking place. Mr. Kline explained that usually that is something done prior to closing.

Mr. Kline explained that the hvac units on the roof of slammers stadium which are for the office, meeting rooms, suite level and club houses. We are looking to replace all 5 units. The current units are 23 years old and we are having issues with them. We have sufficient funds in the building and grounds repairs and maintenance fund for this project.

Councilman Moreno asked how many units there were in total, Mr. Kline said there are 6 but only 5 of the larger units which is what we are replacing.

Slammers Update <u>TMP-9114</u>

Night Train Veek from Joliet Slammers gave an update. He started with the League, the league expanded this year to 18 teams. They will play 51 games this coming year instead of 48. They were able to make big leaps because of all the improvements, and the slammers is very thankful for it. The netting took them down to 0 incidents in the stadium with the new netting and the new fire suppression system is great and they are thankful they have not had to use it.

Resigned the manager to a contract extension. The team had 3 all stars this year.

The Weiner drop was the highest attendance ever with 7300 fans, they would not have been able to pull it off without the support of the city and the improvements made.

The staff is up to 12 people.

They donated 35% more this year including \$30,000 in tickets. They did 2 food drives, a blood drives and more.

They will not being doing glowfest this winter.

Museum Update TMP-9115

Greg Peerbotle, talked about the centennial for route 66 had Catie Sheehan in the museum, she is the new director of tourism for the state. The state will provide \$125,0000 for the centennial event at the prison. This is start in February and Continue until October.

On the prison side the attendance has been great and they had a good turn out for the blues brother movie and the tours.

#### SUBJECT:

Recommendation to Award Payment for the Bicentennial Park Theatre Stage Rigging Replacement to Grand Stage Company in the amount of \$117,000.00.

#### **BACKGROUND:**

Bicentennial Park located at 201 W Jefferson Street hosts events in the theatre throughout the year, including theatrical performances, youth drama camps, concerts, festivals, and City of Joliet sponsored events. The theatre has a hanging rigging system used for the lighting for the stage performances that is no longer sufficient for the needs of the performance space and is out of date.

#### **CONCLUSION:**

The City of Joliet is seeking an award of payment for the theatre stage rigging replacement for the Bicentennial Park Theatre. Staff contacted three vendors to obtain quotes for the scope of work, one returned a proposal. Staff is recommending the purchase be approved and awarded to Grand Stage Company in the amount of \$117,000.00. The 2025 Community Development, Building & Grounds budget provides funding for this painting project (Org 02015000, Obj 524200, \$117,000.00).

<u>Company</u> Grand Stage Company Proposal Amount \$117,000.00

Section 2-438 of the City of Joliet Code of Ordinances states that purchases over twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00) exceptions to written specifications and bidding requirements. The following purchases whose estimated cost is in excess of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000.00) may be awarded without written specifications or bidding. Three (3) of these circumstances apply:

- (a) Purchases which may only be practicably made from a single source;
- (f) Purchases when authorized by a concurring vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the Mayor and City Council;
- (g) Purchases of professional services;

Ann,

Per our conversations, we offer you this quotation to remove and replace the pipe grid over the stage apron and the pipe battens over the stage.

The pipe grid over the downstage area was installed with sub-size pipe and with weak hangers. The stage lighting pipes and tracks were also installed badly. Some of the hangers were terminated with S-hooks instead of shackles.

The pipe grid over the downstage apron should be removed and replaced with a 1 ½" steel pipe grid on 4' centers in both directions. This grid will have a design load of 25 pounds per linear foot (PLF). This is typical of the design loads we use on many TV and theater pipe grids. This will allow you to have a concentrated load of a lighting fixture per foot or 200 LB of capacity for every 8' of pipe with no rocking or swinging.

We offer the same treatment for the area over the stage area upstage of the plaster line. Curtain tracks, drapery and scenery will hang from the grid. We will start the grid 6' offstage of the proscenium opening on each side of the stage and cover from the plaster line to back wall formed by the dressing room walls. This will allow back lighting, side lighting and places to hang scenery with the same design load of 25 PLF.

Our price for the grid over the stage apron will be \$36,000.00.

Our price for the grid over stage will be \$52,000.00.

We offer you five pipes over the house seating to improve the lighting angle over the cove positions around the perimeter of the house. The cove positions are too low to be effective lighting positions. They are about 10 degrees higher than people's faces. The lighting should be 35 to 40 degrees above to avoid shadows on the upstage wall and light people's faces. In order to hang these pipes, we will have to cut round holes through the ceiling.

Our price for the over house pipes will be \$29,000.00.

None of the above rigging is designed or intended for flying people.

Our onsite labor will be union ironworkers. Taxes are not included per the Illinois tax exempt form we received. Our current insurance will be in effect at the time of this work. We have not included a bond.

We include shop drawings. Demolition of the existing pipe grid and battens is included. We will dispose of the non-reusable scrap to an onsite location provided by the city. Our onsite people will perform daily cleanup. The existing stage drapery tracks and plugging strips will be reinstalled on the new grids. If any electrical disconnections or reconnections are needed, we have not included them. We will be using a scissor lift and a rolling scaffold tower.
