**BACKGROUND:**

The City of Joliet owns and maintains nine (9) Fire Stations. Fire Station 1 and Fire Station 9 are in need of interior painting. On December 16, 2025, the City budget was approved by City Council. The funding for the purchase of paint was approved in the 2026 budget.

**CONCLUSION:**

Three (3) supply proposals were received for interior wall painting and sanding proposals for Fire Station 1 are as follows:

Smith Painting Services is the only contractor that includes sanding of the walls and ceiling which will improve the longevity and overall quality of the finished work.

Section 2-438 of the City of Joliet Code of Ordinances states that purchases over \$25,000.00 may be awarded without written specifications or bidding under certain circumstances.

Two of these circumstances apply:

- (f) Purchases when authorized by a concurring vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the mayor and city council.
- (g) Purchases of professional services.

Sufficient funds exist for this project utilizing the Maintenance Fund (Org 30070020, Object 557350, \$67,062.00).

**RECOMMENDATION:**

Based on the above, it is recommended the Mayor and City Council authorize the purchase of painting services for Fire Station 1 from Smith Painting Services in the amount of \$33,212.00, and for Fire Station 9 in the amount of \$33,850.00. The total project cost for Fire Station 1 and Fire Station 9 will be \$67,062.00.

**BACKGROUND:**

The City of Joliet Fire Department’s mission is to protect and enhance the quality of life in the community through education, active intervention, innovative prevention, and professional response. The East Joliet Fire Protection District (“EJFPD”) provides emergency fire and EMS services to areas within unincorporated Joliet Township in Will County. Both agencies seek to work cooperatively to support the citizens of Joliet and the greater Will County region.

To further this goal, the JFD and EJFPD desire to enter a Memorandum of Understanding (“MOU”) acknowledging their shared interest in collaborating on enhanced emergency response operations. The MOU outlines automatic aid responsibilities, response expectations, communication procedures, and operational protocols between both agencies.

**CONCLUSION:**

The purpose of this Memorandum of Understanding is to formalize the conditions by which the JFD and EJFPD will provide automatic aid to one another. This includes shared fire and EMS response within designated areas, communication and command procedures, and the operational expectations of each agency.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

The Administration recommends the Mayor and the City Council approve the attached Resolution that authorizes the Chief of the Fire Department to enter a MOU with East Side Joliet Fire Protection District.

**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE CITY OF JOLIET FIRE DEPARTMENT AND THE EAST JOLIET FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT RELATED TO AN AUTOMATIC AID AGREEMENT.**

**WHEREAS**, the City of JOLIET, Illinois (the “City”) is a duly organized and existing municipal corporation created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Joliet created and maintains the Joliet Fire Department (“JFD”) whose mission statement is to protect and enhance the quality of life in our community through education, active intervention, innovative prevention, and professional response.

**WHEREAS**, the East Joliet Fire Protection District (“EJFPD”) provides emergency services to areas within unincorporated Joliet Township in Will County; and

**WHEREAS**, the JFD and the EJFPD wish to acknowledge in this Memorandum of Understanding that the JFD and EJFPD are working cooperatively to address their mutual interests in supporting the citizens of Joliet and greater Will County; and

**WHEREAS**, the City is a home rule unit of local government entitled to exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs, including, but not limited to, the power and authority to enter into intergovernmental agreements with other agencies.

**NOW THEREFORE**, in consideration of the mutual promises, obligations, and undertakings set forth herein, the JFD and EJFPD agree as follows:

**SECTION 1: In General.**

The JFD and EJFPD agree to provide automatic aid to improve fire and Emergency Medical Services (“EMS”) and emergency response within designated areas for both agencies. The remainder of this agreement outlines response expectations, communication procedures, and operational responsibilities of each agency.

**SECTION 2. EJFPD Automatic Aid into JFD Jurisdiction. (Response 3A & 4A)**

**General.** EJFPD Station 51 provides automatic aid to JFD for fire types ACCINF, STRUCF, and TRUCKF, and first responder EMS response for CAD types AMCPR, AMUNCO, AMCHST, AMSTRK, and AMDOA. EJFPD will initiate patient care and then transfer care to JFD, unless immediate transport by EJFPD is necessary.

Areas within JFD include JFD CAD response 3A and 4A.

**Unit Availability.** Should EJFPD Station 51 be unavailable to respond to calls for service, JFD’s CAD response order shall be utilized.

**Communications and Command.** All operations within Joliet response areas will be conducted on the designated JFD Radio Channel. JFD will assume incident command, and all alarm upgrades will follow the appropriate JFD Box Card.

**SECTION 3. Other Agreements.**

This document shall be the final embodiment of the Agreement by and between the JFD and EJFPD. No verbal changes or modifications to this Agreement shall be permitted or allowed. Changes or modifications to this Agreement shall be made only in writing and upon the necessary and proper signature of the JFD and EJFPD.

**SECTION 4: General Provisions**

- a. In the event that a court of competent jurisdiction shall hold any provision of this Agreement invalid or unenforceable, such holding shall not invalidate or render any provision hereto.
- b. The Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefits of the parties hereto, their successors and assigns.
- c. Venue for this agreement shall be in the courts of the Twelfth Judicial Circuit, Will County, Illinois.
- d. Appendix A through Appendix E are attached hereto and fully incorporated into this Memorandum of Understanding.
- e. This Memorandum may be terminated by either party by notifying the other party in writing thirty (30) days prior to the termination date.

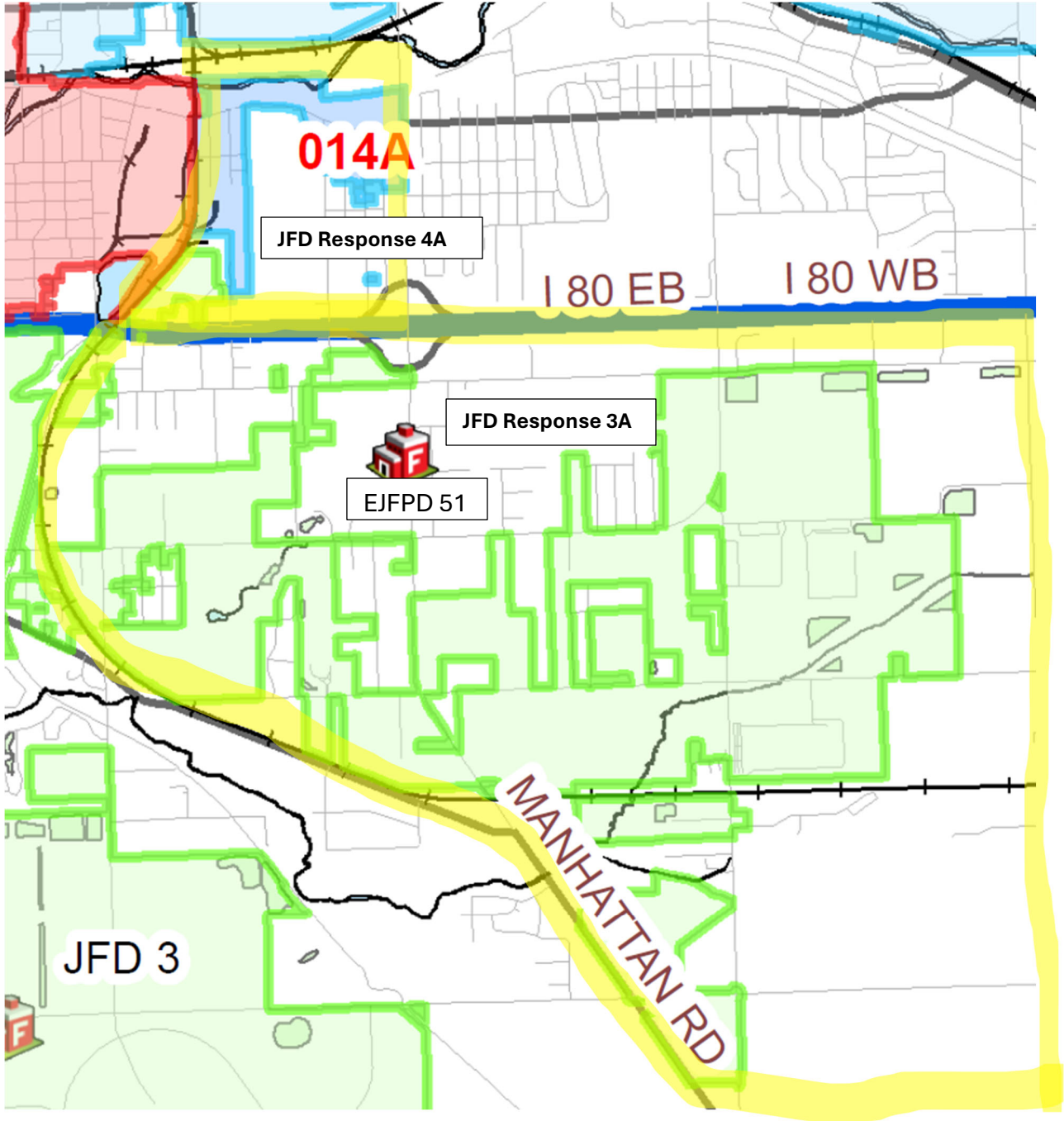

**BACKGROUND:**

The Joliet Police Department has determined the use of license plate reading cameras (LPR's) is of value for criminal investigations. Cameras have been placed at various strategic locations throughout the City of Joliet for years. Two of the locations are Caton Farm Road, just east of Essington Road, and south of Route 6.

**CONCLUSION:**

Caton Farm Road east of Essington Road and south of Route 6 are County Highways under the jurisdiction of the Will County Department of Transportation. To keep an LPR's at these locations, Will County requires that the City of Joliet resign the intergovernmental agreement regarding maintenance, and use of the camera.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

Based on the above, it is recommended that the Mayor and City Council adopt the attached Resolution approving an Intergovernmental Agreement with the County of Will for Continued License Plate Reading Cameras Located on County Highways.

**INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT FOR THE PLACEMENT OF LICENSE  
PLATE READING CAMERAS LOCATED ON COUNTY HIGHWAYS IN THE

**WHEREAS**, the City of Joliet is a Municipal Corporation and situated in Will County, (hereinafter referred to as “MUNICIPALITY”) under and by virtue of the Constitution and laws of the State of Illinois, and has acted in the exercise of its legal authority in the exercise of this Agreement; and

**WHEREAS**, the County of Will is a body corporate and politic (hereinafter referred to as the “COUNTY”); and

**WHEREAS**, Article VII, Section 10, of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970 provides that units of local government may contract or otherwise associate among themselves to obtain or share services and to exercise, combine or transfer any power or function in any manner not prohibited by law or by ordinance; and

**WHEREAS**, MUNICIPALITY and the COUNTY are public agencies within the meaning of the Illinois Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, 5 ILCS 220/1 *et seq.*; and

**WHEREAS**, the Illinois Intergovernmental Cooperation Act authorizes municipalities to exercise jointly with any public agency of the State, including other units of local government, any power, privilege, or authority which may be exercised by a unit of local government individually, and to enter into contracts for the performance of governmental services, activities, and undertakings; and

**NOW THEREFORE**, in consideration of the mutual promises, obligations and undertakings set forth herein, the COUNTY and MUNICIPALITY (hereinafter collectively referred to as “PARTIES”) AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. That the COUNTY has jurisdiction over county highways located in the MUNICIPALITY.
2. That the MUNICIPALITY is desirous to install license plate reading cameras at the location(s) indicated in EXHIBIT A of THIS AGREEMENT.
3. That EXHIBIT A of THIS AGREEMENT may be amended to add or delete locations for license plate reading cameras. Such additions or deletions shall be considered upon written request from the MUNICIPALITY to the COUNTY’s County Engineer, and upon approval of said request by the COUNTY’s County Engineer, EXHIBIT A shall be revised to add or delete the subject intersection.
4. All PARTIES agree that the license plate reading cameras shall be installed by MUNICIPALITY under permit with the COUNTY.
5. That THIS AGREEMENT shall not be construed, in any manner or form, to limit the power or authority of the COUNTY or the COUNTY’s County Engineer, to maintain operate,

improve, manage, construct, reconstruct, repair, widen or expand County Highways as best determined by the COUNTY and as provided by law.

6. The MUNICIPALITY agrees to promptly remove, or cause to be removed, at no expense to the COUNTY, the license plate reading cameras upon receipt of written notification from the COUNTY's County Engineer, at any time and for any reason, that its permit is revoked.
7. The MUNICIPALITY agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the COUNTY, its elected and appointed officials, agents, employees and representatives, and the COUNTY's Division of Transportation, its duly appointed officials, agents, employees and representatives from and against any and all claims, suits, settlements, actions, losses, expenses, damages, injuries, judgements and demands (collectively referred to as "claims") arising from and relating to the use and/or placement of the license plate reading cameras at the location(s), including but not limited to misuse or improper sharing of private or personal information, constitutional challenge or personal injury. The MUNICIPALITY further agrees to pay all damages, judgements, settlements, costs and expenses incurred by the COUNTY, including all reasonable attorney's fees and court costs, in connection with or resulting from such claims against the COUNTY.

Nothing contained in this paragraph 7 shall be construed as prohibiting the COUNTY, its elected and appointed officials, agents, employees and representatives, from defending through the selection and use of its own agents, attorneys and experts, any claims, suits, demands, proceedings and actions brought against them. Pursuant to Illinois law, 55 ILCS 5/3-9005, any attorney representing the COUNTY, under this paragraph, is to be appointed a Special Assistant State's Attorney. The COUNTY's participation in its defense shall not remove MUNICIPALITY's duty to indemnify, defend, and hold the COUNTY harmless, as set forth above.

8. That nothing contained in THIS AGREEMENT is intended or shall be construed as in any manner or form creating or establishing a relationship of co-partners between the parties hereto, or as constituting the MUNICIPALITY (including its elected officials, duly appointed officials, officers, employees and agents) as an agent, representative or employee of the COUNTY for any purpose or in any manner whatsoever.
9. That each party warrants and represents to the other party and agrees that (1) THIS AGREEMENT is executed by duly authorized agents or officers of such party and that all such agents and officers have executed the same in accordance with the lawful authority vested in them pursuant to all applicable and substantive requirements; (2) THIS AGREEMENT is binding and valid and will be specifically enforceable against each party; and, (3) THIS AGREEMENT does not violate any presently existing provisions of law nor any applicable order, writ, injunction or decree of any court or government department, commission, board, bureau, agency or instrumentality applicable to such party.

10. That THIS AGREEMENT shall be deemed to take effect as of the date on which the duly authorized agents of the last of the parties hereto to execute THIS AGREEMENT affix their signatures.
11. This document shall be the final embodiment of THIS AGREEMENT by and between the COUNTY and MUNICIPALITY. No oral changes or modifications for THIS AGREEMENT shall be permitted or allowed. Changes or modification to THIS AGREEMENT shall be made only in writing and upon the necessary and proper signature of the COUNTY and MUNICIPALITY.
12. In the event that a court of competent jurisdiction shall hold any provisions of THIS AGREEMENT invalid or unenforceable, such holdings shall not invalidate or render unenforceable any other provision hereto.
13. THIS AGREEMENT shall be binding upon and inure to the benefits of the parties hereto, their successors and assigns.
14. Venue for enforcement of this agreement shall be in the courts of the Twelfth Judicial Circuit, Will County, Illinois.
15. Except for data shared and or/retained on a case by case basis for legitimate law enforcement purposes only, the MUNICIPALITY shall not share or transfer data collected from license plate reading cameras placed on or within COUNTY highways or rights-of-way with any federal, state, local, or private entity for purposes of creating or adding to a vehicle location service or database.
16. The MUNICIPALITY shall, apply to the Illinois State Archives Records Management Section to establish a specific records retention plan for all records generated by or maintained pursuant to the operation of license plate reading cameras. No permit to place cameras in the COUNTY's highways or rights-of-way shall be issued by the County Engineer until such time as the MUNICIPALITY presents evidence of a certified plan of records retention from the Illinois State Archives Record Retention Section.
17. Any license plate reading camera data in the possession of MUNICIPALITY and not otherwise exempt, is subject to disclosure to the general public under the Illinois Freedom of Information Act (FOIA), 5 ILCS 140/1, *et seq.* as a public record. In the event the County of Will (or any of its officers, agents, employees or officials) receives a request under FOIA for documents relating to this intergovernmental agreement or COUNTY's authorization for the MUNICIPALITY to install and operate license plate reading cameras on or within COUNTY highways or rights-of-way pursuant to this intergovernmental agreement, the MUNICIPALITY shall provide to the County of Will at no cost and within the timeframes required under FOIA, a copy of any such "public record" as required by FOIA and in compliance with the provisions of FOIA. MUNICIPALITY may identify any such records, or portions thereof, that it in good faith believes to be exempt from production, including its justification for such exemption. MUNICIPALITY shall be responsible for any costs or damages associated with defending the request for exempt treatment.

**SUBJECT:**

Resolution Requesting Authorization to enter into a Regular 2025 Justice Assistance Grant Intergovernmental Agreement between the City of Joliet and Will County

**BACKGROUND:**

For the past seventeen years, the Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant has been made available to the City of Joliet and Will County. Awards are based on population and the number of Part I violent crimes each jurisdiction reports to the Federal Bureau of Investigation. These funds have been used for law enforcement purposes, generally for items that are not funded through the regular budget.

The requirements for this grant program indicate that the funds must be shared with Will County, which takes on the greatest burden of housing arrestees. In 2025, one Justice Assistance grant is available to the City of Joliet and Will County: the FY 2025 JAG. After discussing the award with Will County Representatives, the FY 2025 award of \$96,673 will be split equally between the two agencies, each receiving \$48,336.50.

The Joliet Police Department has elected to allocate funds to two projects: continuing to activate the law-enforcement-specific mental health app Cordico and submitting DNA evidence to private labs for cold case investigations. The department has made the mental health app available to all current and retired department members and their families for the past 4 years. Members have found the resources invaluable in mitigating the significant trauma they address as law enforcement employees. In addition, funds will be made available for private lab testing of evidence collected at cold cases. These labs specialize in extracting DNA profiles from old and degraded materials, something the Illinois State lab is unable to do.

Will County has elected to use their portion of the funds to equip half of the SWAT team with ballistic vests.

The City of Joliet Police Department will be responsible for all programmatic and financial reporting, submitting all necessary paperwork, and, if awarded, will accept the award on behalf of both agencies.

**CONCLUSION:**

The budgeted items will assist the Police Department in ensuring continued mental health support for our members and in pursuing new avenues of DNA evidence collection. There is no required local cash match.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

Based on the above, it is recommended that the Mayor and City Council approve the City Manager to sign the Intergovernmental Agreement awarding the \$96,673 from the Bureau of Justice Assistance.
