



FINDINGS OF THE LIQUOR COMMISSION
ISSUANCE OF A LIQUOR LICENSE

Based on a public hearing that took place on Wednesday, February 28, 2024, the Liquor Commission of the City of Joliet hereby reports its findings based on Chapter 4, Section 5C of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Joliet to the City Council. The findings are as follows:

1. (a) **Applicant:** ROCHELLE SAENZ
d/b/a FAMILY DOLLAR #26629

(b) **Address of premises:** 861 N. LARKIN AVENUE, JOLIET, 60435
2. **Class of liquor license applied:** Class C – Package Goods Only
3. **Past Performance:** Applicant has no prior experience in sales and/or service of alcoholic liquor.
4. **Character and reputation of the applicant:** The applicant is of good character.
5. **General design and layout of the premises:** On file in the Mayor's Office.
6. **Amount of anticipated gross revenue from sale of alcoholic beverages:** 10%
7. **Nature of entertainment:** N/A
8. **Premise compliance with all ordinances of the City:**

Building Inspections Department states there are no building code violations.

Joliet Fire Department states there are no fire code violations.
9. **Any outstanding monies owed to the City of Joliet:** There are no monies owed to this address.

11. Zoning, general character of the neighborhood and the impact of the premises of the surrounding neighborhood and the city as a whole:

The subject business is an existing Family Dollar store located in a standalone building on the west side of Larkin Avenue, south of Vernon Avenue. The property is zoned B-1 (neighborhood business district), and package liquor sales are an allowable use in this zoning district.

Surrounding zoning and land uses include:

- North: B-1 (neighborhood business), retail (Auto Zone)
- East: R-2 (single-family residential), residential (Kings Acres subdivision)
- South: B-1 (neighborhood business), auto repair business (Mike More Miles)
- West: R-5 (multi-family residential), residential (Larkin Village apartments)

12. Any law enforcement problems created by the issuance of the liquor license:

In consideration of the application for a liquor license to be issued at 861 N. Larkin Avenue, we have reviewed the calls for service at this location. Our records reveal that, in the past 12 months, there have been 104 calls for service to this location, including several serious crimes.

Based on the above, we foresee that the issuance of a liquor license at this location would exacerbate existing law enforcement problems in this area. We ask that this application be denied.

13. Comments at the hearing:

The liquor hearing was conducted by Deputy Liquor Commissioners James O'Connell and Kevin Kelley, Assistant Corporation Counsel Chris Regis, and Detective Pat Schumacher.



14. Recommendation:

Based on the liquor hearing, the Liquor Commission feels that the issuance of the liquor license would not be in the best interest of the city, and therefore, recommends denial of the issuance of the liquor license.
