Partnership with IKEA to Apply for the Transportation Improvement Program Grant

BACKGROUND:

The IKEA Distribution Center (650 Emerald Drive) approached the City with an opportunity to co-apply for the <u>Transportation Improvement Grant Program</u> through the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP). The grant requires the applicant to have a municipal sponsor.

The grant would cover the installation of 12 electric vehicle chargers:

- 4 Level 2 Chargers
- 4 ChargePoint CP6000
- 4 ChargePoint Express Plus

The four Level 2 chargers would be available for public use, which would help build out the EV infrastructure in Joliet.

The grant requires a 20% match, which will be covered by IKEA. The City of Joliet is not required to provide any funding for this project.

The City of Joliet would be responsible for the oversight of compliance of the grant.

The grant application is due on December 20, 2024.

EXHIBIT A

IKEA Joliet EV Charger Project Description

IKEA seeks to install Electric Vehicle (EV) charging at its facility located at 650 Emerald Drive, Joliet, IL 60433. These chargers will support 3 different use cases; Co-worker charging, Final Mile Delivery Fleet charging and Heavy Duty vehicle charging.

Co-Worker Charging

IKEA has a goal to reduce our Co-worker emissions by 50% by 2030. Providing EV charging at all our stores and distribution centers is a big part of that. We intend to install 4 Level 2 chargers at the facility that will be open to the public including all co-workers. The chargers we have chosen will be the CT4000 series from ChargePoint.

Final Mile Fleet

We also have a goal of providing all our customers within 30 miles of a store or facility with zero emission home delivery. For this we need to provide charging for our final mile delivery fleets. We will install 4 of the ChargePoint CP6000 series chargers that are activated by RFID cards for fleet use. This will enable 4 electric delivery vehicles to charge overnight to perform deliveries each day from the facility.

Heavy Duty Charging

IKEA will purchase 4 electric yard trucks to move shipping containers around our facility. These will need to have charging available at all times. For this we plan to install 4 charging heads for ChargePoint's Express Plus fast charging system. The Express Plus can distribute up to 400kWh of electricity for a single vehicle. We will also make these chargers available for our supplier vehicles; those trucks delivering or picking up containers from our facility. This can effectively double the operating range of these vehicles. We've already talked to ChargePoint about designing the chargers in a way that allows larger vehicles to charge regardless of the location of their charging port.

Summary

In sum, we plan to deploy 4 co-worker chargers, 4 fleet chargers, and 4 HD yard truck and supplier chargers at Joliet. The location of these chargers will be in the southeast corner of the facility, which is shown below. Note the nearby utility connection as well.
